I would like to say a heartfelt 'THANK YOU' to everyone.

A number of special moments and achievements happened over the autumn term. Firstly, we held our first whole school event with invited community to join us for Harvest Festival. Secondly, we held our usual Christmas calendar of events for the first time since the pandemic. This was a great success and it was very emotional to see the whole school returning back together celebrating the true meaning of Christmas with the Nativity and Christmas market. Nearly all pupils achieved their first term of accreditation through the AQA for all key skills. Two pupils have been attending Croesyceiliog School for further Maths lessons and this year we have added ICT lessons ready to prepare for their entry level GCSEs.

We had a MOVE celebration day to celebrate their 25th year anniversary by holding an achievement assembly followed by fun activities.

We have reintroduced links with Trevor Palmer a longstanding member of our international community supporting responsible assistance across the world for both pupils and young adults.

Since losing our therapy dog Binky we have trained another staff member's dog to undertake this role. With great success Gamora has become an active member of the school community. Pupils are benefiting through this intervention both from a curriculum purpose but also supporting wellbeing and attitudes to learning.

Mr Osmond as Curriculum lead has introduced a new authentic learning opportunity through the Police Cadets. They have been attending school for both the tertiary department and Class 2. Helping to develop and volunteer for personal development opportunities through the VPC. Most of all they have had fun, exciting experiences and learnt about policing.

We celebrated St David's Day and we all worked very hard towards the Eisteddfod, entering competitions based on writing, digital skills and art. Da iawn, pawb!



up as our favourite characters. We worked hard on our entries


for the Eisteddfod!

Eisteddfod Bard Winner!




